Venue: Seminar Hall of The College

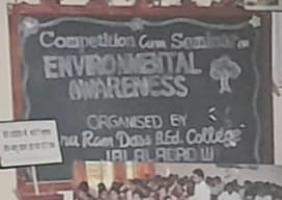
Date: 16 September 2017
